With so many options out there, it can be confusing and time-consuming to research the various EHR solutions. To help you make the right decision for your organization, follow this helpful checklist.

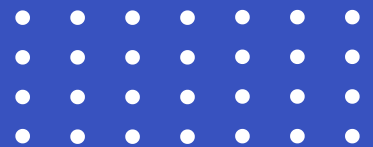

**01****Identify your top 5 pain points.**

Are you drowning in paperwork? Not able to access your caseload easily? Write down the 5 biggest challenges your organization is facing. Examples: Tough to find files and track client outcomes, information kept in disparate systems, ever-changing compliance laws, accurate billing, or spending too much time on clerical tasks.

**02****Determine what your EHR should provide to help you work more efficiently and effectively. Make a list, then rank them in priority order.**

This usually includes a telehealth component, ease of use, patient portal, scheduling, billing, data security, and analytics.

- In the past two years this has become more important than ever. A strong telehealth component allows providers to provide care from anywhere while maintaining HIPAA compliance.
- Patient portals are becoming extremely important. A patient portal can allow clients to access records, sign documents, and schedule or cancel appointments.
- Billing, analytics, and scheduling all save time and help your agency run more efficiently.

**03****Determine who the decision-makers are in your organization.**

If you aren't the decision-maker, determine who you need to work with within your agency to procure and implement an EHR system. It's good to have a dollar amount in mind as you shop for an EHR and know who can provide sign offs and approvals.

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#### **Don't skimp on discussing implementation and training.**

Implementation of your new EHR can take a significant amount of time and often there is a separate cost for implementation. Understand which of your team members will need to be involved, and find out how the EHR company organizes their implementation process. Some companies give you a "get started sheet" and others have a one-to-one relationship that manages the product build out from start to finish alongside you. Decide which one you need and which one they offer.

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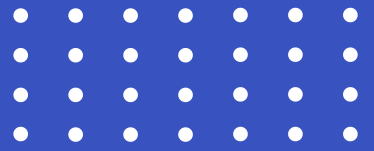
#### **Now you are ready to do your research and schedule a demo!**

To find the best EHR system, ask around. Word of mouth is often the best way to find top-notch vendors. There are also review sites like Capterra, Software Advice, and GetApp.

Choose your top 3 EHR systems and book a demo. Ask if their teams have expertise in your industry. Clarify costs, features, and support:

- What are the price tiers and what does each include?
- Are there add-ons?
- Is there a cost per user or per client?
- What is the implementation fee?
- What is the monthly fee?
- What is the time frame of the contract?
- What other applications does your agency use?
- What integrations does the EHR offer?
- Ask about support, trainings, and knowledge hubs and resources and how the EHR vendor will ensure your team is able to leverage its offerings.
- How often is the EHR software updated or new features released?
